Many people will not read beyond the “headline”, when it contains the word “stewardship”. For them the “turn off” is ... What are they asking money for now? This time nothing is asked except that you use this opportunity to LIVE WELL.

Lisa Van Tassel Attends Ministry Fair

I was privileged to attend the Ministry Fair at the Cathedral on February 24th. Present at the Fair were representatives of many of the 93 parishes in the Diocese.

The day began with registration and looking at booths put up by church charities. At 9:30 we all went into the nave of the Cathedral to pray for a successful fair. The Rt. Rev. Duncan M. Gray III, the Bishop of Mississippi, recounted the tragedy of Katrina, but also the hope that our caring and sharing have permitted as well as the re-building that is going on. At lunch a love offering was taken up. A total of \$4500 was collected. Donations will be accepted until the end of this week and the Diocese will match any amounts collected dollar for dollar. At the end we sang a new hymn written for centennial anniversary. We then adjourned to the various workshops. We walked into the nave as strangers but by the end of the service we were becoming old friends.

I chose to attend the Eucharistic Visitor Training. About 18 – 20 of us listened attentively to what a wonderful and valuable experience the training will be for all concerned. The ministry f is designed so that properly trained lay persons can be commissioned to take the sacraments to shut-in's or to people in hospitals.

The afternoon workshop about Spiritual Discernment was lead by Bishop Alexander. Yours truly managed to get there early so did not have to stand but ended up sitting up next to the Bishop. He held our attention nearly went over the time limit.
